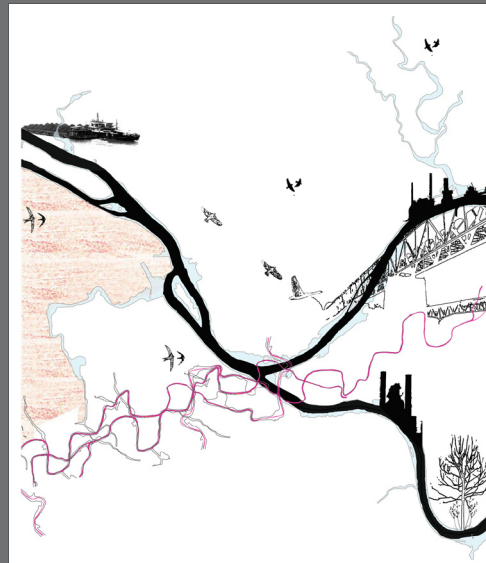

Maggie will travel to Mali and focus primarily on Bamako to study different patterns of inhabitation, circulation, and proximity to resources dispersion of the community. Her analysis will illustrate a more expansive definition of urban infrastructure that includes social and cultural phenomenon as networked resources. Her study will serve as a model of spatial strategies that can support the community's ability to efficiently disperse resources as well as sustaining a healthy environment.



Emily's travel plan will take her to Denmark and The Netherlands to research Dutch and Danish approaches to urban ecology and the use of wind power to offset the energy demands of urban areas. She will also explore the sites and research public education, participation and acceptance process on how these could be translated to the U.S. The research will reinforce her studies on the intersection of resource management, social conditions, and innovative design solutions to create a more just, creative, and sustainable land system.
